

Stereoplacer Elements — Next-gen pan control, streamlined

Stereoplacer Elements is a frequency-specific panning tool. This plug-in is a simplified version of Stereoplacer, with fewer, simpler controls.

Stereoplacer Elements is most commonly used to restore the stereo image from a mono recording. This could be anything from archive material that was only ever captured in mono to new recordings limited by the number of inputs in a given session. Pan lower notes to the left and higher notes to the right in order to create a realistic stereo image from a mono piano recording, for example. Stereoplacer Elements is also indispensable when building a track from older samples, taming drum loops with wacky panning by nudging fundamental frequencies back towards the centre.

Just like an EQ, Stereoplacer Elements uses bell curves and high and low shelves to sculpt the audio, with a maximum of two bands per plug-in instance.

- Restore archive recordings.
- Fix poor microphone placement.
- Pan individual sounds from sample loops.
